**** 2009 CONVENTION IN PIGEON FORGE, TENNESSEE ****

The 54th ANNUAL TARS CONVENTION will be held October 1 – 3, 2009 at the Music Road Hotel in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee. Pre-Registration form and Hotel reservation information are included in this newsletter. Please take care of these items early to help avoid delays or possible sell-outs.

The Music Road Hotel and Convention Center in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee is conveniently located just off the Parkway @Traffic Light #1 and is surrounded by local attractions and restaurants. All of their functions will be held on site, so your attendance at the meetings, exhibits, and contests will be only a few moments walk from each other.

CONTESTS

Some contests scheduled are the Vehicle Extrication contests, the Rescue Challenge, the Emergency Care Contest, the (EVOC) Emergency Driving Contest, and The Rambling Rescue Race. Don't forget the Horseshoe and the Turn-Out Gear Competitions. Rules and entry forms have been sent to your squad, so get with some fellow members and enter.

TRAINING

According to experts, the most critical safety issue at the scene of a large animal incident is the responders' lack of knowledge of and experience around large animals. Most Emergency Responders in North America live and work in urban or areas and have little contact with large animals such as horses, but thousands of these critters pass through their jurisdictions ever year. Even if you work in the downtown area of a large city, sooner or later you could get that dreaded call. A trailer rollover! If you are first to arrive on the scene and assume command, would you know how to handle the animals involved? Most rescue personnel don't. . .

The seminar is scheduled for 1:00 pm – 4:00 pm. Be sure to indicate on your pre-registration form your plans to attend Thursday's training seminar. A Seminar certificate with 0.3 CEUs will be awarded to attendees. Cost is only \$10 with conference Pre-registration. Seminar by itself or at the door is \$20. Classroom activity only, casual dress is acceptable.
