

A Message from Our State Vice President, Dujuana Naylor Hello everyone! First off I would like to say thank you for your continued

support; serving this organization is one of my greatest pleasures. It was also a pleasure to be able to assist with our February Region travel training sessions. For those of you who could not attend, I just want to share some important things to remember with warmer weather approaching.

- 1. Start your rehab now; you should be drinking at least 64 ounces of fluid a day, preferably water.
- 2. Make sure that you have a plan to rehab everyone on your scene, not just your members.
- 3. Have a plan for mental and physical rehab after the call is concluded.
- 4. Be prepared for passive and active cooling if needed/required.
  - a. Passive= remove clothing, move to shaded area, fluids
  - b. Active= mist fan, cool towel (not cold)
- 5. Make sure that your members are drinking enough to satisfy their thirst but not too rapidly.
- 6. During high stress the body burns more calories, have some type of protein snack available. Example: beef jerky, peanut butter
- 7. Have water and some type of electrolyte replacement available.
  - a. Dr. Gilson, TARS medical director recommends Vytalyte due to its electrolyte components.

There is a full training calendar this year. I encourage each of you to get out and attend a class and take pride in the educational opportunities that your organization provides. Work hard, train harder! Remember we are all in this together and out to reach a common goal; making a difference and saving lives. Get ready for convention there will be a lot of new things going on and trainings available. Get your awards nominations and memorials sent in early, show your personnel the pride you have in them. I look forward to seeing everyone there. I also look forward to having the opportunity to continue serving you and this great organization as I work to move forward as your president. Your vote and continued support will be greatly appreciated.

- 7. Change- You have to be opened minded about change. We have to change with the time. Change is not always bad.






#### A Message from Our Region III Vice President, Charlie Tollison

Hopefully with this behind us I'd like to digress from the norm in a different direction to our TARS State Training Coordinator, Brian Robinson. I'm probably by far his worst "critic", but let's look in a very positive direction. Having known Brian since he came through our Scouting program, beginning in 1991, there has always been that desire to be the best at whatever he undertakes.

That brings me to this. Just a few months ago Brian announced that he was working on a new and revised extrication program for TARS that would bring us up to date in today's ever changing mobile world. He also said, that his goal was to shorten the time necessary for beginner extrication training so new members could begin to respond quicker and to assist all Squads/Units getting their new members on the trucks quicker to help alleviate the state wide man power shortage.

For the past few months Brian has literally spent many, many hours, virtually around the clock to accomplish this goal. The program is very professionally presented so that at any time any member can go back and review any aspect of extrication that they feel that needs review. The training manuals can be used in class then returned or they may be purchased for visual review.

I would like to challenge all instructors, current and those wishing to join this team of professionals to put this same effort into getting every member of your Squad/Unit or Fire Service up to current standards. Now it is up the instructors to maintain and grow what Brian has begun. This will mean wherever extrication may be needed from Memphis to Mountain City in the great state of Tennessee the same "knowledge and skill", will be the norm without exception.

The TN Commission of Firefighting Personnel Standards and Education has recently reviewed the new TARS Extrication Program and has approved the curriculum, thanks to our TARS State Training Coordinator, Brian Robinson.



#### A Message from Our Training Coordinator, Brian Robinson

The Training Program continues to grow and expand and I want to personally thank all of the students, agencies, instructors...well, basically anyone involved from the beginning to the end. There have been a lot of "firsts" in the last year and most of those came about as the result of your needs, requests, ideas, frustrations and support. One of those items was the need for a new Vehicle Rescue Program. In April of this year, TARS officially launched its new Awareness/Operations Level Vehicle Extrication Program with the support and backing of internationally recognized instructor Ronald Moore. This program was built on suggestions from instructors in the field who wanted more flexibility, more pictures, more options, and overall just something other than red background slides with yellow words. Shortly after the initial launch, the program was presented to the TN Commission on Firefighting Board and it was approved as recognized training meeting the standards of NFPA 1006 and 1670 for Awareness and Operations Level Training with respect to vehicle rescue. Another first happened during the instructor updates based on input from the instructors in years past regarding the offering of an online option. While a daunting task to say the least, we were able to offer a live and online version simultaneously to try to accommodate those that wanted an onsite event, as well as, those that did not wish to travel. We had instructors who attended the event from Texas, on vacation in Florida, and as a collective group at their agencies. From the evaluations, several agencies stated it saved their agency money and valuable time by offering this option. The BIG "first" is right around the corner related to the Annual TARS Convention. We asked for input at last year's convention regarding how to make it better, more fun, or more informative. Several of the surveys stated that you wanted rescue related training available during the event, affordable pricing, and competition changes. So, listening to what the members want, make sure you pay close attention to the schedule of events this year. Most of the competitions are going to be moved to the dead period on Saturday afternoon so as not to conflict with meetings/other events and Friday is going to be filled with several rescue

related training options. I am literally trying to offer as many training options possible from Wednesday through Friday at varying schedules and levels to accommodate anyone's desires or needs. While some of the classes will require a fee to attend due to the cost of instructors/materials, many of the options will be at an affordable cost or **FREE**. All I ask is that everyone do three things for me personally as your State Training Coordinator related to convention. The first is to make sure that you submit your team entry forms and class registration forms before the deadline because with the new competition and class format it will require scheduling prior to the event. The second request is to remember that the competitions are supposed to be challenging and fun and a lot of people both within and outside of our Association graciously volunteer their time, knowledge and resources to set-up, coordinate and judge these events. **EVERYONE** is a winner for taking the initiative and competing but far too many people get mad, frustrated, their feelings hurt, or overall just refuse to ever come back if they do not win. **EVERY** judge is critiquing you and your team to make you better and offer ways to improve your skills and safety so when it's not a staged competition and it's for real out in the field you and your team perform flawlessly, safely and efficiently and win something far more valuable than a plastic trophy...*the chance to* save someone's life. The third and final request is to keep an open mind related to the "restructuring". I am a firm believer in honoring and protecting the past and its traditions while still trying to raise the bar related to fun and education. With proper planning and input, collectively as an Association, there should be no reason why the past/present/future can't seamlessly merge. So in closing, thanks again to everyone in every capacity that has helped with training this year and keep the ideas and frustrations coming back related to ways you see your Association can better itself and grow. As the old saying goes, "you cannot fix what you do not know is broken".
