May God bless and keep you all safe during our upcoming year and I look forward to seeing you all in February.



Hopefully everyone had a MERRY CHRISTMAS and a good start to the NEW YEAR.




# A Message from Our Region I Vice President, Scott Stewart


# A Message from Our Region IV Vice-President Tim Moss
